

Brussels, March 29, 2019 - The European Confederation of Directors' Associations (ecoDa) has elected Jan Wesseldijk new chair of the confederation. Mr Wesseldijk is replacing outgoing chair Irena Prijovic. He is a board member of NCD (*Nederlandse vereniging van Commissarissen en Directeuren*), the Netherlands Association of Corporate Directors.

During her chairmanship, Irena Prijovic has been instrumental in advocating the diversity of Corporate Governance models in Europe. The board thanks her for her leadership role as chair, and for having set the tone towards a true community.
