A., Deutsche Bank's captive insurance company. Before joining Deutsche Bank group in 2012, Dirk spent 16 years in risk and insurance management at a German automotive company. Dirk graduated as "Diplom-Kaufmann" at the University in Cologne after studying Economics and Business Administration, followed by a trainee program with a German Insurer, where he started his career as a Third Party Liability Underwriter.
